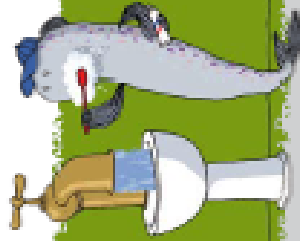
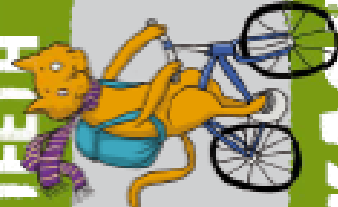

# Malala Yousafzai Wins the Nobel Peace Prize

Malala Yousafzai, a young teenager from Pakistan, said she was in chemistry class at her school in Birmingham when a teacher took her out to tell her that she had become the joint winner of this year's Nobel Peace Prize.

The seventeen year old, who was shot in the head by the Taliban in 2012 for fighting for girls' right to education, is the youngest winner of the award which she shared with Kailish Satyarthi, an Indian campaigner against child trafficking and labour.

Malala said winning the Nobel Prize had made her more determined to



fight for the right of all children to an education.

"It's sometimes difficult to express your feelings but I really feel honoured. I felt more powerful and courageous because this award is not just a piece of metal or a medal that you would wear, or an award that you would keep in your room," she said.

Malala said she has given up her plan to become a doctor and has now decided to become "a politician, a good politician."

Malala also said of her prize "I believe the Nobel committee haven't given it just to me, but this award is for all those children who are voiceless, whose voices need to be heard."

There was great joy in Malala's home town in Pakistan as her former teachers, classmates and relatives celebrated her award. Her old school is planning to hold a celebration in her honour.

The Pakistan army last month said it had arrested 10 Taliban rebels involved in her attempted assassination.
