

ADMISSIONS TO FIRST YEAR

St Munchin's College operates a fair and transparent entry process. All applications for first year are made through the Limerick Schools Post-Primary Schools Common Application System (CAS) on the standard application form. Forms and details are available from St. Munchin's College, our website and from primary schools.

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Boys who are nominated by the College Trustees having regard to the Ethos of the School.
2. Sons, Grandsons and Nephews of current and former staff members who are or have been employed by the Board of Management.
3. Boys whose brothers attend St. Munchin's College or have graduated from St. Munchin's College.
4. Boys whose fathers are past pupils of St. Munchin's College.
5. Boys who attend Scoil Ide.
6. Boys who are permanent residents in the parish of St. Nicholas as defined by Parish boundaries, regardless of which primary school he attends
7. Boys who attend Parteen / Meelick National Schools and Clonlara National School.
8. Boys from the following National Schools in no order of priority: An Mhodh Scoil, Bridgetown N.S., St. Patrick's N.S., St. Mary's Boys N.S., St. Brigid's N.S., Limerick School Project, John F Kennedy Memorial School, Caherdavin Boys N.S., Cratloe N.S., Killaloe N.S., Ballina N.S., Gaelscoil Sairseal.
9. Boys from all other national schools.

Should the college be oversubscribed, places will be offered starting with category 1 as listed above, and then proceeding to category 2, 3 etc in the order listed above. If the number of applications in a category exceeds the total number of places remaining to be allocated, then a lottery basis will apply for the allocation of the remaining places for that category.

St. Munchin's College is a Catholic Voluntary Secondary School for boys only, operating under the Patronage of the Roman Catholic Bishop of Limerick. The school is managed by a Board of Management, is funded by the Department of Education and Skills and operates within the regulations and guidelines set down from time to time by that Department.

Pupils & Programmes

There are presently 650 pupils in the school. The following programmes are offered:

- ✓ DES Junior Certificate and Leaving Certificate examinations.
- ✓ The Transition Year Programme, which is optional.
- ✓ The Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme, which is optional.
- ✓ The Leaving Certificate Applied Programme, which is optional.
